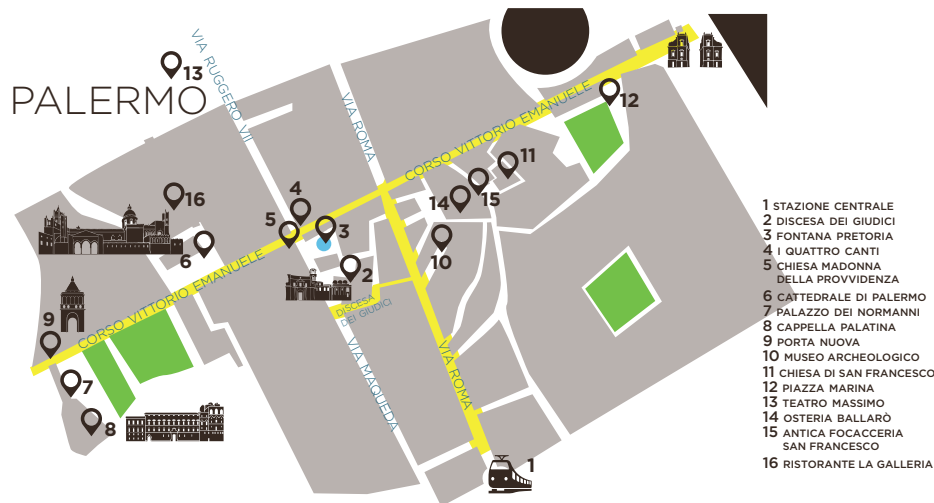

If you want to visit Palermo we suggest stopping in Termini Imerese and taking the train.
Ask to the reception for more information.

- Termini Imerese (62 Km, 50 min. driving)
- Highway A19 direction Palermo, exit Termini Imerese.
- Follow directions to the Train station

PALERMO

1) From the central station go straight and take Via Roma until Discesa dei Giudici on the left. Continue this way to visit: 2) Santa Maria dell'Ammiraglio known as "La Martorana" and the church of San Cataldo 3) To visit Palazzo Pretorio and Fontana Pretoria turn right onto Via Maqueda. The square is called "Piazza della Vergogna", vergogna means shame, because the statues are all naked. 4) I quattro canti: the geographic center of the old city, an octagonal square known also as the "Theatre of the Sun" because during the day at least one of the faces is illuminated by the sun. 5) Church of "Madonna della Provvidenza" or San Giuseppe and its spectacular decorations: located in one of the corners of the intersection. 6) The Cathedral of Palermo. 7) Palazzo dei Normanni: a royal residence of the rulers of the Kingdom of Sicily. Since 2015 it is a UNESCO world heritage site. 8) Cappella Palatina: constructed in 1140 as a private church of the royal family. It is completely covered in gold and the most visited monument in Sicily. A UNESCO world heritage site since 2015. 9) Porta Nuova: the main "door" and entrance to the old city. On the right side of Via Roma: 10) Archeological museum. 11) Church of San Francesco. 12) "Piazza Marina" and "Villa Garibaldi": at the end of Corso Vittorio Emanuele (right side). 13) Teatro Massimo: continue straight on Via Roma for about 1,3 km, then turn left and take Via Cavour. For your lunch break we suggest: 14) "Osteria Ballarò" in Via Calascibetta. 15) "Antica Focacceria San Francesco" in Via Alessandro Paternostro. 16) "La Galleria", a little restaurant slightly off the touristic road behind the Cathedral.



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DAY 1

The villages of the Madonie

If you would like to spend a peaceful day in the neighborhood, we suggest you visit the "Parco delle Madonie" and its scenic surrounding countryside. We suggest starting with the town farthest away (Gangi) and then making your way back while visiting the other towns listed. At the entrance of the village follow the road until the deviation on the left to reach the highest point Petralia Soprana (upper town), a little medieval village. We recommend visiting the church of "Santa Maria di Loreto" for its spectacular view and the "Chiesa Matrice". A special suggestion for your lunch break is the trattoria "Da Salvatore", a certified slow food destination (tuesday closed). Petralia Sottana (lower town) is the newer village where you can stop to see the cathedral. Between Petralia Sottana and Polizzi Generosa you will pass the town of Castellana Sicula. If you are a chocolate lover or an ice-cream lover, we suggest that you try "Ferruzza", a master chocolatier. You will find the shop on the main road, on the right hand side. Polizzi Generosa is famous for its beautiful churches and the view of the highest peaks of the Madonie mountains. You will find the deviation after Castellana Sicula, on your right.

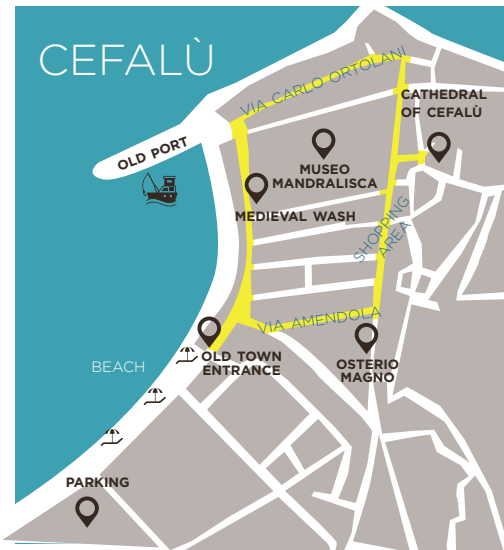
All the villages suggested below are on the SS120 road.

Gangi (46 Km, 1h driving, ss120),

Petralia Soprana (35 Km, 50 min. driving, ss120),

Petralia Sottana (31 Km, 44 min. driving, ss120),

Polizzi Generosa (25 Km, 35 min. driving, ss120 and ss643).



DAY 2

Cefalù

One of the most beautiful towns in Sicily. Cefalù is a medieval fisherman village on the coast between Palermo and Messina. Once you arrive in the town, follow the main road (via Roma) to the first roundabout and turn left until the seaside.

Note: suggested restaurants are in the old town between the "old port" and the "Cathedral". Cefalù (85 Km, 1,10h Driving) Highway A19 Direction Palermo Highway A20 Direction Messina, exit Cefalù

Castelbuono (23 Km, 30 min. driving from Cefalù) - Famous for its castle. ss113 direction Messina and ss286 direction Castelbuono (35 Km, 39 min. driving from Cefalù).

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DAY 3

Piazza Armerina and Villa del Casale

The roman mosaic town Villa del Casale is a Roman villa which represents one of the biggest and best preserved roman mosaic surfaces in the world. In 1997 with its 3500 mq of mosaics, became a UNESCO world heritage site.

Piazza Armerina (90 Km, 1,20h driving)

Highway A19 direction Catania, exit Mulinello,

Sp7a direction Provincial road 4 and SS117bis.

Enna (64 Km, 55 min. driving) On your way back stop at Enna just to enjoy the view. When it's a clear day you will be able to see mount Etna.

Highway A19 exit Enna

Wine tasting and winery tour, Regaleali (14 Km, 40 min. driving), reservation necessary.

Provincial road SP64 direction Valledolmo.

At the entrance of the village follow the sign Regaleali Case Nuove.

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
